### 2018 Statistics Updates

The One Life...Many Gifts curriculum was designed to support teachers in discussions about organ and tissue donation for transplantation with students. The curriculum is both educational and engaging and can be used in many courses including science, civics, health and physical education and religion. Since its inception, the curriculum has been used in classrooms around the province and though the information remains relevant some statistics need to be updated.

#### Waitlist updates

- There are currently more than 1,500 Ontarians waiting for a lifesaving organ transplant. Every three days someone dies waiting.

#### Registration rate updates

- On June 30, 2018 the organ and tissue donor registration rate in Ontario was 33%.

#### Registration updates

There are three ways to register consent to organ and tissue donation in Ontario. An Ontarian is eligible to register if they are 16 years or older and have an Ontario health card. Please note, donor cards are no longer used in Ontario.
